Similar to any other economic sector, the academic education plays a significant role in boosting the country economic status. It has been considered an investor partner, as it now operates with established structures and principles. It offers returns and has its own set of guidelines, stakeholders, and responsibilities. At present, the academic institution is not just a missiondriven entity, or it is purely commercial or profitoriented, instead, it serves as a valuable investment prospect for the private sector, a platform for deploving capital and business ventures, a hub for experts in various fields, and a center for cuttingedge research and advanced technology, as well as contemporary sciences and future-oriented studies.
