This aligns with the concept of meritocracy, whereleadersarechosenbasedon competenceandability, rather than wealth or lineage.

Healsoaddressedthepublicand

respectful correction of mistakes during prayer, which reflects the principle of accountability and strengthensahealthyorganizational culture. He considered the imam's adherence to the same rules as the other worshippers as a manifestation of the concept of "rule of law," a fundamental principle in managing any society. By dealing with mistakes openly, this fosters anenvironmentofcooperationand positive interaction.

Al-Obaidli'sstudyalsoexplored the flexibility in congregational prayer, where individuals can join even if they arrive late, reflecting theimportanceofadaptabilityand flexibility in governance systems. Thestudyalsoincludedlessonson how to accommodate individuals withspecialneedsandemphasized the value of teamwork.

Inconclusion, Dr. Al-Obaidlicalled for areassessment of how Muslims canutilizereligiouspractices, such as congregational prayer, as a meanstoimprovegovernanceand administrative systems.


















#### Ahlia University Students Engage with Emirati Peers and Representatives from Global Universities
